
What if....

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS



Connect more people to area **SUPPORT SERVICES** and help them navigate difficult systems

- Continue to promote LVT as the central hub for neighborhood resources
- Create new means for other area service providers to share information about resources for individuals experiencing homelessness, etc.
- Expand LVTRise resource connections related to financial literacy, budgeting, and managing credit/debt
- Provide immigration services support to area residents

Support SINGLE PARENTS AND CARETAKERS in the neighborhood

- Expand child care and early childhood education offerings in LVT
- Strengthen a Parent-to-Parent Network in Las Vegas Trail

Help parents lower monthly household costs through existing programs

Did you know....

New services for parents are coming to the LVTRise Community Center soon! A new Child Development Campus will start construction this fall/winter and include Early Head Start, Head Start, child care and Pre K programming!

MY IDEA for,

MOMS Group!

Champion **PARENT INVOLVEMENT** at local **SCHOOLS**.

- Implement Safe Routes to Schools program in the area
- Encourage afterschool programs and apprenticeship opportunities for youth that build neighborhood stewardship and sense of ownership
- Continue regular communication with area school leadership to increase knowledge share
- Continue to cross-promote educational, mentorship, and after-school programs at LVTRise
- Establish a parent liaison specialist that can help create a local PTA

Did you know....

LVTRise Community Center is bring in a new staff position - a parent liaison specialist that will help build stronger relationships with area schools!

Create more opportunities for residents to **BUILD SKILLS** for success.

- Expand career job trade or training, career and employment coaching for area residents
- Make it easier to find/get a GED/Adult High School diploma in the LVT neighborhood
- Provide legal support for clearing of criminal records
- Identify new transportation options for local residents to reach job training in surrounding areas and downtown

Create opportunities for area residents to **PARTICIPATE IN CHANGE**.

- Continue/Expand opportunities to employ and compensate local residents in cleanup, maintenance, and beautification of the neighborhood
- Identify a job training pipeline for local residents to participate in larger public works projects

Support area residents to **START NEW BUSINESSES**.

- Respond to community desire for local small business classes/training
- Increase access to small business support resources in LVT

A new standard for our HOUSING

To set a new standard for quality housing in the area that will ensure the neighborhood continues to offer **Safe**, **Stable**, **Affordable**, and **Accessible** housing to all residents regardless of family size, race, ability, or means, we must...

- A. Make Las Vegas Trail a better **FRONT DOOR** for the neighborhood
- B. Make Calmont at LVTRise the **HEART** of the neighborhood
- C. Pursue **REDEVELOPMENT** of specific multi-family complexes
- D. Improve **QUALITY OF LIFE** in higher-density housing
- E. **HOLD APARTMENT OWNERS/MANAGERS ACCOUNTABLE** for the safety, cleanliness, and quality of their properties
- F. **STRENGTHEN CONNECTIONS** among multi-family complexes

Make Las Vegas Trail a new **FRONT DOOR** for the neighborhood


- Implement Road Diet on Las Vegas Trail Envision Las Vegas Trail as the central spine of a new network of trails in the neighborhood
- Encourage better development and design along Las Vegas Trail
- Focus PID attention on Las Vegas Trail and neighborhood intersections
- Infill neighborhood services and/or public facing uses along Las Vegas Trail starting with node at N Normandale / Las Vegas Trail Roundabout






LAS VEGAS TRAIL (between Calmont Ave. & Sierra Trails Apartment)


What if Las Vegas Trail was redesigned to bring the neighborhood together.

Improve **QUALITY OF LIFE** in higher-density housing

- Encourage improvements to open/shared spaces within multi-family complexes
- Create incentives for multi-family properties to improve interior lighting
- Explore ways to give residents agency or stipend to seek repairs for issues in their units

HOLD APARTMENT OWNERS/MANAGERS ACCOUNTABLE for the safety,

cleanliness, and quality of their properties

 Create a new means to track, collect, and respond to resident complaints or claims against multi-family property-owners or managers.

Pursue **REDEVELOPMENT** of specific complexes

 Acquire select properties and develop plans for mixed-income housing development


STRENGTHEN CONNECTIONS among multi-family complexes

- Continue to build stronger relationships between LVTRise and area property managers
- Encourage removal of fences separating individual apartment complexes











What if we explore what's allowed to be built in the area under City's Zoning Ordinance to see how new developments could better serve residents.

Continue efforts to reduce crime & improve

PUBLIC SAFETY in LVT

- Make information about City policies and services easier to access and understand.
- Connect those in need with services and support that will make a long-term impact.
- Crack down on businesses in the area that continue to be havens for crime, prostitution, and drug use.
- Reduce physical barriers between multi-family properties
- Increase lighting and landscaping in public spaces known to be prone to draw loitering

To ensure the neighborhood is more **Connected**, **Green**, **Supportive**, and **Safe** for every resident as it grows, we must...

- A. **ACTIVATE PARKS** and open spaces throughout the neighborhood
- B. Build COMMUNITY PRIDE and support NEIGHBORHOOD LEADERS
- C. Host **COMMUNITY EVENTS, ACTIVITIES, & PROGRAMMING** that bring the people together
- D. Make connections to local schools, transit, and neighborhood services along **NEIGHBORHOOD STREETS** (refer to map on slide 23)
- E. Make area service destinations MORE WELCOMING and accessible
- F. Brighten up **STREETS AND PUBLIC SPACES** in LVT
- G. Rethink **CAMP BOWIE** uses, design, and connections
- H. Continue efforts to reduce crime & improve **PUBLIC SAFETY** in LVT



ACTIVATE PARKS and open spaces throughout the neighborhood

- Create a network of trails connecting neighborhood destinations, parks, and residences
- Increase the diversity of amenities in local parks and open spaces
- Encourage Apartment Complexes and Churches to use area parks for events and activities

What if... parks and open spaces in Las Vegas Trail offered a wider variety of things to do for all seasons, ages, and interests!

Public input gathered through this planning process tells us that residents want more to do and more amenities for families and kids!














Did you know....


CALMONT AVENUE (between Mojave Trail & Phoenix Dr.)

CALMONT AVENUE (between Mojave Trail & Phoenix Dr.)


PROPOSED: STRIPED BIKE LANES AND CENTER TURN LANE

What if... we think even bigger! How would the neighborhood feel if the largest streets were made into boulevards with trees and landscaping!






What if....

Host COMMUNITY EVENTS, ACTIVITIES, & PROGRAMMING that bring the people together

 Expand programming and events that build community connections and celebrate neighborhood pride

Brighten up **STREETS AND PUBLIC SPACES** in the neighborhood


- Install street lighting where neighborhood streets intersect with higher-traffic roads
- Install more lighting in area parks



Make connections to local schools, transit, and neighborhood services along

NEIGHBORHOOD STREETS (refer to map on slide 23)

- Implement a road diet on Las Vegas Trail, Calmont, and North and West Normandale
- Implement traffic calming measures on neighborhood streets, with particular attention to pathways to area schools
- Refresh pedestrian safety infrastructure and striping at key intersections.
- Formalize a pathway for students to the rear of IDEA Rise school.



Make area service destinations **MORE WELCOMING** and accessible


- Ensure pedestrian safety infrastructure is present at important intersections and midblock crossings used to reach existing neighborhood services
- Improve the neighborhood-facing wall of Kroger
- Create contiguous, safe sidewalk connections to the Fiesta Mart along Cherry
- Work with property owners to improve sidewalk conditions and connections to storefronts





W. NORMANDALE STREET (between N. Normandale Street & Valley Hill Lane)




PROPOSED: PROTECTED BIKE LANES AND CENTER TURN LANE

What if... lane reconfiguration and a new bike facility could slow speeding drivers and make it easier to cross W Normandale to reach the Kroger and other stores.



Rethink **CAMP BOWIE** uses, design, and connections

- Reduce vacancy along Camp Bowie by expanding the uses and types of development allowed along the street.
- Encourage new business and industrial development / infill along Camp Bowie in alignment with the City's Economic Development Strategy
